What is it?

A supplemental nursing system is a feeding tube attached to a bottle that contains either formula or breast milk for supplementary feeding at the breast. This allows mom to breastfeed baby even though baby is being supplemented. Using a supplementer is a great way to get a mom to still benefit from the bonding experience even if mom has no milk at all. If baby is going to be supplemented for any reason, it's always best to use a nursing supplementer "SNS".
